

What advice would you give future Math 15 students to help them succeed?

- Keep up with all of your homework assignments as well as you can do your homework without help you don't need to worry about exams, you'll do great.
- Engage with the class
- Do the homework as soon as possible and review
- GO to pirate sessions, do all the homework and ask questions
- Do the homework early so that you can attend office hours if you have questions.
- Do the home works and ask for help because they help develop skills.
- Attend pirate sessions and office hours as often as possible
- Go to office hours
- do all the problems assigned
- do the homework early
- Start on homework early!
- To utilize the out of lecture resources such as Pi-rate sessions and Professor Grood's office hours.
- I would rely more on the textbook problems to help you study rather than the WebWork problems.
- If you are new to Calculus you are gonna need to attend every lecture and most of the pirate sessions because it is really easy to get confused on the webwork and written problems since every day in class it is something new or expanded on so you do not get to master much of anything.
- Go to office hrs and request a tutor early on if struggling
- Do all of the homework assignments
- Try your best to make the time to learn how to do all of the practice problems, and make sure to understand why certain concepts apply to each problem.
- go to class!
- do webwork first and attend lectures
- CHECK/REDO YOUR WORK! CHECK THE SIGNS! on webwork CHECK YOUR PARENTHESIS!
- Pay attention to lecture
- Definitely do the Webwork first, it helps you make sure you understand the concepts/application before starting the written homework. Also, doing the homework works! Like genuinely gives you more practice with the material so you feel better prepared for the exams.
- go to pirate sessions
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- start working on the problems the day it is given so you can ask questions later.
- Do your homework as soon as possible so you can go to the Pirates Sessions and ask questions. Keep a positive mindset when solving problems because when I told myself I was having fun doing them, I started understanding the material better.
- Take advantage of pirate sessions when confused.
- I would tell them to go over all the concepts as soon as she introduces them so you aren't trying to study everything the last minute.

- Do all your assignments on time and always revise class materials straight from class. Postponing is a bad attitude to succeed in Math 15
- Make use of her office hours! They are extremely helpful even if you think you might not need to go
- Please go to pi-rate sessions and office hours, even when you don't think you need it. I find that doing homework during these times makes me more focused.
- Go to office hours!!!
- keep up to date with the webworks
- Watch videos to grasp the material
- DO the work
- Pay attention in class, do plenty of homeworks, look over your homework before exams
- do the homework and go to lecture
- Do the homework early and attend lecture
- Think of the homework/attending pirate sessions as a job that you have to go to, integrate it into your schedule.
- Take good notes during lectures as it will help you with homework and attend office hours to talk with Professor Grood about course material and ways you could improve.
- Go to class and go to office hours even if you don't need it. She's really fun to talk to and she's also kinda mother...so it works well. Just don't fall behind in homework because it is kind of easy to get lost in the amount that's due, but Grood will also help with that so it'll all be fine in the end.
- Definitely do the webwork first it's a lot of help with written assignments. Written assignments are what was the most difficult to kick off.
- The frequency of homework assignments will help you get comfortable with the material. Don't get too behind on homeworks
- Use any form of help you are provided with, even if you have taken calculus before, the pirate sessions and office hours are very helpful to solidify your knowledge of content.
- get the homework done as soon as possible
- Go to pirate or math clinic sessions
- Attend every class or risk falling behind
- Attend office hours, attend pi-rate sessions, attend clinics. The sooner you get yourself involved in the different math activities to help you, the sooner you'll thank yourself.
- If you do the practice problems and all the homework, studying for the tests requires very little effort because you will have learned a majority of the material.
- go to lecture!!
- Go to office hours
- Make sure you actually come to class.
- Understand all the homework, don't just do it for the sake of doing it.
